3. EXTERNAL AUDIT UPDATE:

5. PENSION ADMINISTRATOR UPDATE:

POSITIONS UPDATE:

Ms. Adams provided an overview of the Current Vacant Positions chart. It was noted that the Administrative Specialist II Position for the front desk/reception, as well as the Executive Assistant to Pension Administrator position, have been filled. Ms. Adams also confirmed that S. Tatman had been promoted from Internal Auditor to Deputy Pension Administrator.

The Senior Human Resources Technician position is on hold for reclassification to Human Resources Specialist.

The Human Resources Specialist V position is now vacant/on hold; to be posted soon. The previous posting did not result in adequate candidates. We now have a limited-term Human Resources Specialist V position.

In addition, the Request to Fill (for) the Internal Auditor position will be sent to Human Resources soon.

Lastly, thanks to Director Cade and Deputy Director Stewart, the office has been granted three positions in the FY23 Governor's Recommended Budget. This has not occurred since 2008. Historically, the biggest area of staffing concern involves the Pension Administration Section.

NEW ENTITIES:

Two new entities were approved to join DPERS at the January 28, 2022 Board Meeting:

- The Mid-Sussex Rescue Squad was approved to join the County/Municipal General Plan effective January 1, 2022.
- The City of Newark retired members of Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #4 were approved to join the State of Delaware County and Municipal Police/Firefighter COLA Fund.

These entities are fully funded.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE:

(INTRODUCED) House Bill 248: This Act requires the State to reimburse healthcare expenses incurred by eligible pensioner spouses on Medicare who are required to enroll in their former employer's healthcare coverage and their former employer's coverage pays less than the State's coverage would pay. Ms. Adams stated that this basically 'undoes' the existing spousal coordination of benefits, having a huge negative impact on OPEB liability.

(INTRODUCED) House Bill 295: This Act contains technical cleanup of definitions as well as updates to the Delaware Code for the Judicial Plan.
